



A Look Back at the Youth & Teen Summer Library Program

Escape the Library: Our youth engaged in an immersive and intellectually stimulating event where they had to work collaboratively to solve a series of puzzles and riddles.

Scavenger Hunt: Using teamwork and strategic thinking the youth had to look for clues to find hidden treasures in the library.

Adventures in Cake Decorating: Youth were given a specified time to decorate a cake in the given theme of Create Your Own Adventure. The results were astounding.

Survive the Library: Our participants had to navigate MESSY and often SMELLY obstacles and complete tasks to "survive" and exit the game.







Aug. 13th, 4 pm Bubble Art: Tailored for elementary-age children, this imaginative workshop will combine the fun of blowing bubbles with the creativity of painting on canvas. It provides a unique opportunity for artistic expression through interactive play.

Aug. 20th, 4 pm Bug Tasting: A teen-requested program, where youth will explore entomophagy by sampling various types of edible insects, including worms and crickets. This experience encourages culinary curiosity and discussions about sustainable food sources.

Sept. 4th, 1 pm Egg Drop Challenge: Designed for homeschoolers, this STEM-focused activity invites participants to engineer protective structures for eggs, safeguarding them from a high drop. It fosters problem-solving skills and creativity in engineering.

Sept. 10th, 4 pm DIY Fall Slime: A delightful and accessible program for elementary children, where participants will create their own fall-themed slime. This hands-on activity promotes sensory exploration and fun.

Sept. 17th, 4 pm Comic Creating: A stimulating challenge for ages 12-17, this program will encourage participants to develop their own comic strips. It will focus on enhancing storytelling and artistic skills in a supportive and creative environment.

Oct. 2nd, 1 pm Homeschool Pumpkin Volcano Library Program: This innovative educational program will allow homeschool students to explore the intersection of science and creativity through a hands-on activity. Participants will construct their own "volcanoes" using pumpkins and engage in a dynamic chemical reaction demonstration that mimics volcanic eruptions. This program not only fosters a deeper understanding of chemical reactions and scientific principles but also encourages creativity and problem-solving.
