



<u>The Tuesday Evening Book Club will be reading Hilary Mantel's Wolf Hall. Please join us at 5:00 on January 28, 2025!</u>

New York Times bestselling author Hilary Mantel's Wolf Hall Trilogy is the magnificent, riveting historical saga of the rise and fall of Thomas Cromwell in the court of Henry VIII, featuring Anne Boleyn, Thomas More, Jane Seymour, and other political and royal players from Tudor England.

The Man Booker Prize-winning novels Wolf Hall and Bring Up the Bodies served as the basis for the six-part BBC and PBS Masterpiece television series starring Academy Award-winner Mark Rylance as Thomas Cromwell and The Crown's Emmy Award-winner Claire Foy as Anne Boleyn, and were adapted into award-winning and critically-acclaimed stage plays in London's West End and on Broadway.


